Drop Off and Pick Up – Big Crowds Expected!

Please follow these instructions to maximize student safety.

- 1) Give yourself plenty of time and drive slowly around the neighborhood.
- 2) If you are driving and want to join your child on the playground before school, please park a block or two away and walk.
- 3) If you are driving and dropping off your child, please go in the direction that places your passenger side door on the school's side of the street.
- 4) Never park in front of our neighbors' driveways, in red zones, or blue zones unless you have a disabled placard.
- 5) There is no parking except for the disabled spots adjacent to the school. There is limited parking across the street from our school.

So that teachers can get started right away, *please say goodbye to your 1st through 5th grade children on the playground*, rather than following them into their classrooms. *Kindergarten parents will be bringing their students to the MPR*, saying goodbye from there, and staying with me for a quick orientation before heading to the library for a

Welcome Coffee on the first day. On the 2nd and 3rd days, kindergarten students will be dropped off in the MPR as well. Teachers will meet them on the playground for the first time on the morning of Thursday, August 25.

Lists will be posted outside the main school entrance and will remain there until Monday at about 9:00.

Adventure Time's New Location

You probably received information from Adventure Time this summer. Just in case you did not, here is important information about morning drop off and afternoon pick up procedures: The Adventure Time program is now located in the school MPR. When dropping off and picking up your children please access the MPR through the Sunnyhills Rd. entrance. It is important if your child is scheduled for morning care, he or she is escorted to the MPR and signed in each morning. If your child is scheduled for afternoon care, please come to the MPR to sign your child out at the parent table. We will have a teacher escorting to and from the MPR and playground. You may meet your child on the playground after signing out and collecting your child's backpack and possessions. Please do not pick up directly from the playground without first checking in at the MPR and signing your child out. We look forward to seeing you August 21!

Safety Patrol - 5th Graders

Fifth graders interested in serving our community as members of our safety patrol are invited to submit applications the first week of school. Applications are available on the school's website.

Lunches and Snacks

All students should bring lunches and a morning snack (or a plan to get a cafeteria lunch). We have many children with severe nut allergies, so we respectfully request that you avoid sending food with nuts. Please remind your students that they may never share food with their friends. Lunches can be purchased for \$2.50 and milk is \$.40. You may send cash with your child or write a check to OUSD and bring it to the office to purchase multiple lunches in advance.

Allergies and Critical Medical Issues

If your child has any serious medical conditions, please inform the teacher on the first day. We will be sure to have a Health Plan in place as soon as possible. If your child needs to take over-the-counter or prescription medication, please bring the completed form signed by a doctor authorizing us to dispense. Increasing Safe and Secure Schools - All must enter the main door by the office.

Our superintendent has placed a high priority on making our schools as safe and secure as possible. Therefore, all gates must be locked between 8:45 and 1:20 on minimum days and between 8:45 and 2:35 on full days. This means we are not to open the playground gates even for people we know well during the school day. When you arrive, please stop by the office and sign in first. We understand this is not always convenient and appreciate your cooperation in helping us meet this expectation.
